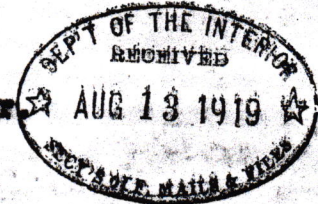

Sir:

I have the honor to transmit herewith the papers in the matter of the heirship to the estate of George Redeagle, deceased Quapaw allottee No. 136 and 144, who was allotted the W/2 of the NW/4 and the NW/4 of the SW/4, Section 28, the SE/4 of the NE/4 and the NE/4 of the SE/4, Section 29, Township 29 N. of Range 24 E. of the T. N., Oklahoma, containing 200 acres, under the Act of March 3, 1895 (28 Stat. L., 207), and a restricted fee patent was issued therefor September 26, 1896.

A sale was partly completed to Wesley Smith for the NW/4 of the NW/4 of Section 28, and the NE/4 of the NE/4 of Section 29, Township 29, Range 24, Ottawa County, Oklahoma; and the E/2 of the SE/4 and the E/2 of the SW/4 of the SE/4, Section 21, Township 29, Range 23, being a part of the allotment of Hulda White, Quapaw, set aside to George Redeagle by decree of court, was sold to B. A. Kwert, a suit for the recovery of which is now pending.

The allottee also died possessed of a 1/3 interest in the allotment of Minnie Redeagle, Quapaw allottee No. 136 and 144, and an undivided 1/4 interest in the allotment of Cha-bah-squi Goodeagle, Quapaw allottee No. 190 and 208.

The decedent also died possessed of an apparent inherited interest in the estate of Julia Pelka Crow Redeagle, deceased Ottawa allottee No. 129, which interest will be disposed of in that case (43508-1918).

\$50.00 personal property is reported by the Examiner, but the source and place of deposit is not shown. No homestead rights are involved.

The evidence adduced at the hearing shows that the allottee died November 19, 1918, unmarried but with issue, leaving surviving as heirs to that part of his estate above set forth, his daughter, **Josephine Redeagle Abrams**, and his sons, **Leroy** and **Doan Redeagle**, entitled to share equally in his estate in accordance with the laws of descent of Oklahoma in force at the time of his death.

The allottee was married twice, first to **Minnie Goldspring Redeagle**, and then to **Julia Peika Crow**, both of whom predeceased him.

One **Marie Tate Harris** has set up a claim as the legal wife of the decedent; however, the evidence discloses that there was no legal marriage between the parties, for the reason that she had not obtained a divorce from her first husband, **John Harris**, on the date that she attempted to marry the allottee

The proceedings in the matter of the heirship to the estate of **George Redeagle**, deceased Quapaw allottee No. 134-144, are hereby approved pursuant to the provisions of the Act of June 25, 1910 (36 Stat. L., 855), as amended by the Act of February 14, 1913 (37 Stat. L., 678), and the Regulations of the Department, and I find and adjudge that at the date of the hearing held March 31, 1919, the heirs to the estate of the decedent

were as follows:

Josephine Redeagle Abrams, daughter - - - 1/3
Leroy Redeagle, son - - - - - 1/3
Dean Redeagle, son - - - - - 1/3

The decedent also died possessed of an apparent inherited interest in the estate of Julia Pelka Crow Redeagle, deceased Ottawa allottee No. 129, which interest will be disposed of in that case (See 43208-18).

\$50.00 personal property is reported by the Examiner, but the source and place of deposit is not shown.

No homestead rights are involved.

A fee of \$15.00 is to be collected by the Superintendent in accordance with the provisions of the Act of May 18, 1916 (39 Stat. L., 123-127).

Real Property owned by George Redeagle, Quappaw No. 134 and 144.

Original allotment to-wit: SW NW Section 28, and NW SW of Sec. 28 and SW NE and NE SE of Section 29, Township 29 Range 24, 160 acres, Ottawa County, Oklahoma.

Of his original allotment a sale was partly completed to Wesley Smith of the NW NW Section 28, and the NE NE of Sec. 29, Township 29 Range 24, Ottawa County, Oklahoma.

The E2 SE and E2 SW SE of Section 31, Township 29 Range 23, the same being a portion of the allotment of Hulda White, Quappaw, set apart to George Redeagle by decree of court and sold to B. A. Ewert in a suit for the recovery of which is now pending.

An undivided one third interest in the allotment of Minnie Redeagle, Quappaw No. 135 and 145 as per heirship finding of March 3, 1915, and described as follows to-wit: The SE Section 14, Township 29 Range 23, and NE SE of Section 31, Township 29 Range 24, and the NE NW of Section 28, Township 29 Range 24.

An undivided one-fourth interest in the allotment of Cha-bah-squi Goodsagle, Quappaw No. 190 and 206, See heirship find April 25, 1914, and described as follows to-wit: The SW of Section 26, Township 29 Range 23, and the SW SW of Section 25, Township 29 Range 23, and the SW NE of Section 18, Township 29 Range 25.
