In the matter of a hearing to be held before Ire C.

Deever, Superintendent, in the heirship case of Alexander Mudd, deceased Quapew allottee, No. 177, continued from September 24, 1913, comes now, George Redesgle, a Quapew Allottee of the Quapew Reservation, who is of legal age, and first being duly sworn, answers the following questions:

- Q. What is your name and age, and of what tribe of Indians are you a member?
- A. My name is George Redesgle, 1 am 48 years of ege, and e member of the Queper Indians.
- Q. Were you well acqued nted with Alexander Mudd? A. Yes, I know him all his life time.
  - Q. About when did Alexander Mudd die?

    A. He died during the summer of 1898, as near as 1 can remember at about the age of 15 or 16 years.
  - Q. Was Alexander Mudd merried at the time of his death?
    A. He was never married, and never ever had any children.
  - Q. What was Alexander Mudd's father's name? A. His name was E-bas-ke.
  - Q. About when did E-bes-ke die? A. As well as I can remember, he died about 1881.
  - Q. Do you know who Alexender Modd's mother was?
    A. I do not remember his mother, neither can I recall her name.
  - A. I knew of one sister. Emily Hughes, who died at the Chilocco Indian School in girlhood, never ever having been married, and never ever having eny children.
  - Q. Did you know Johny Coldspring, and about when did he
  - A. He died August 3, 1901. I was well acquainted with him.
  - 2. At the time of his death, was he married, and did he leave any children?
  - A. es, he was married to my sister, Grace Redeagle, and left one child, a son, Walter Coldepring, both of whom are now living.
  - Q. Did you know Mary Coldspring, and is she living or dead?

    A. I knew her well, and she died during the February 1, 1894, unmarried and without children.

Q. Were you acqueinted with General Earrison, and about when him

A. I was acquainted with, and as well as I can renerter he died about the year 1893.

Q. At the time of his death, were he merried or single, and did he leave any children?

A. He was married at the time of his death to leabelle Harrison, now McCoonse, and he never had any children.

Q. Did you know Khe-deh-she-hun-ke or Grandesgle? When did he die?

A. Yes. I was acquainted with him. He died

e. At the time of his death was he married or single, and did he leeve any children?

A. He left a wife, Eah-deah Grandeagle, but left no living children or descendents.

- Q. Did Khb-deheshe-hun-ke have any brothers or sisters?
  A. Yes, I am informed, Pius Quapew, was a brother, and
  Wah-teh-noh-zhe, a sister.
- Q. Were you acqueinted with Mah-shing-teh-neh Zavier, and when did she die?

A. I was well acque inted with her, and she died about March 16, 1912.

Q. Was she married at the time of her death, and did she leave any children?

A. She was married at the time of her death, leaving a husband, James Kavier, and three children, Annie. Thomas and Joseph, now dead.

Q. About when did Joseph Mavier die?
A. I think he died about the 8th day of February, 1914, at the age of 10 or 12 years of age.

Q. Did you know Joe Buffelo, if so, about when did he die? A. Yes, I was well acqueinted with him. He died about the year 1907.

Q. Was he married at the time of his death, and did he leave a

wife and children?

A. He was married, leaving a wife, Sinrie Brown-Ruffelo, and sixe children, viz: Arthur Buffelo, by a former marriage, Henry, Clara, Hezel, Bora, Willie and an infent that died shortly after his death.
