In the matter of the heirship case of Robert Lottson, deceased Quapaw allottee No. 153 & 164, comes now George Bedeague who being of legal age and first being duly sworn answers the following questions under oath:

- Q. What is your name and age?  
A. My name is George Bedeague and I am 46 years of age.
- Q. Were you acquainted with Robert Lottson and his family history?  
A. Yes.
- Q. About when did he die?  
A. In 1907 or 1908 I am not positive which.
- Q. Was he married or single at the time of his death?  
A. He was married to Lucy Lottson, now Lewis, who is living.
- Q. Were there any children born to Lucy Lottson by Robert Lottson?  
A. Yes. They had a number of children, but they all died young with the exception of Lou Lottson who reached the age of about 19 years before he died and was never married. The names of the other children I do not know.
- Q. Did Robert Lottson have any other children by any other woman?  
A. Not that I know of.
- Q. Who was Robert Lottson's father?  
A. I do not know.
- Q. Who was Robert Lottson's mother?  
A. Kah-stet-tah.
- Q. Did Robert Lottson's father and Kah-stet-tah have any other children besides Robert?  
A. No.
- Q. Do you know whether Robert Lottson's father had any children by any other woman?  
A. I do not know.
- Q. Did Kah-stet-tah have any other children by any other man except Robert Lottson's father?  
A. Yes. After the death of Robert Lottson's father she married John Beaver, a Quapaw Indian and by him she had one boy and two girls.
- Q. What were their names?  
A. The oldest girl's name was Mes-kah-no-zhe and the next

Q. What were their names?

A. The oldest girl was named Yes-kah--no-she who died prior to the death of her mother and before allotment, while a young girl. The next girl is named Alice Beaver-bear who is now living. The boy was named Frank Beaver who died February 23, 1903 at the age of about 10 years.

Q. Is Kah-stet-tah living or dead, if dead about when did she die?

A. She is dead, having died a few years before allotment.

Q. What kind of an Indian was Lucy Lottison?

A. Osage Indian.
