In the matter of the heirship case of Robert Lottson, deceased Quapaw allottee No. 153 & 164 comes now Peter Clabber, who being of legal age and first being duly sworn answers the following questions under oath:

- Q. What is your name and age?  
A. My name is Peter Clabber and I am 65 years of age.
- Q. Were you acquainted with Robert Lottson and his family history?  
A. Yes.
- Q. About when did he die?  
A. He died several years ago.
- Q. Was he married at the time of his death?  
A. Yes. He was married to Lucy Lottson, now Lewis.
- Q. Were there any children born to Lucy Lottson by Robert Lottson.  
A. Yes.
- Q. How many children did they have?  
A. They had several children, but I do not know how many but they are all dead, none of them having been married or had any children.
- Q. Was Robert Lottson ever married to any other woman?  
A. No.
- Q. Who was Robert's Lottson's father?  
A. Jim Crow.
- Q. Who was his mother?  
A. Her name was Kah-stet-tah.
- Q. Were there any other children born to Jim Crow and Kah-stet-tah besides Robert Lottson?  
A. ~~Yes there were three other children, one boy and two girls~~

- Q. Did Jim Crow have any children by any other woman?  
A. No.
- Q. Did Kah-stat-tah have any other children by any other man?  
A. Yes. She had three other children, a boy and two girls by John Beaver.

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- Q. Is Jim Crow dead and if dead about when did he die?  
A. He is dead, having died several years before the allotment of the Quapaw Reserve.
- Q. Were Kah-stat-tah and John Beaver married after the death of Jim Crow?  
A. Yes.
- Q. What were the names of the three children born to Kah-stat-tah by John Beaver?  
A. The oldest one a girl, was named Yes-kah-no-she who died prior to the death of her mother while yet a young girl. Alice Beaver-Bear was the next child and she is now living. Frank Beaver was the name of the last child and died at about the age of 10 years.
- Q. Is Kah-stat-tah living or dead, if dead about when did she die?  
A. She is dead, having died before the Quapaw Reserve was allotted.
- Q. There was Robert Lottson living when he died?  
A. He was living in the Osage Nation on his wife's allotment.
- Q. What kind of an Indian was Lucy Loutsone?  
A. She was an Osage Indian.
