

Frank Buffalo died May 3, 1898, survived by his wife, Alice, and one child, a son, John Buffalo. His share of his father's allotment passed to his son, John, subject to a dower of the widow of Buffalo Calif, and subject to the dower interest of the widow of Frank Buffalo.

Alice Brown Buffalo, the wife of Joe Buffalo died September 4, 1900. Her dower interest in this estate became extinct, leaving her son, John Buffalo, the sole heir to his grandfather's allotment, subject to the dower interest of his grandmother, Mary J. Calif.

Joe Buffalo died March 25, 1907, survived by his wife, Sinnie Brown Buffalo and six children, viz: Arthur Buffalo, Henry Buffalo, Clara Buffalo, Hazel Buffalo, Nora Buffalo and Willie Buffalo. Thus the one-half of the decedent's allotment passed in equal portions to these six children, subject to the dower interest of their grandmother, Mary J. Calif, and to the dower interest of Sinnie Brown Buffalo, the wife of Joe Buffalo.

Mary J. Calif died December 7, 1912, thus her dower interest in the estate of her husband, Buffalo Calif became extinct.

Sinnie Brown Buffalo died January 7, 1913, thus her dower interest in the one-half of the allotment of Buffalo Calif became extinct, leaving the six children of Joe Buffalo, sole heirs to one-half of the allotment of their Grandfather, Buffalo Calif.

Therefore the allotment of Buffalo Calf should be partitioned as follows:
