

In the matter of the heirship case of Red Sun Quapaw, Quapaw allottee, Nos. 18 and 19, comes now, Francis Quapaw, who is an allottee of the Quapaw Reserve, and who is of legal age and first being duly sworn, answers the following questions:

- Q. What is your name and age?  
A. My name is Francis Quapaw, and I am 65 years of age.
- Q. Were you well acquainted with Red Sun and her family history?  
A. Yes, Quapaw.
- Q. About when did she die?  
A. She died about June 22, 1915, having been for many years or all his life a neighbor of the
- Q. Has Red Sun married at the time of her death?  
A. She was married.
- Q. Who was her husband?  
A. John Quapaw, who is now living.
- Q. Did she have any children by John Quapaw?  
A. She had one, a daughter, Frances Quapaw Gokoy, who is now living.
- Q. Did Red Sun ever have any other husband besides John Quapaw?  
A. Yes.
- Q. What was her first husband's name?  
A. I have heard that she was first married to Louis Tall Chief, or Louis Angel, who is now living.
- Q. Did Red Sun have any children by Tall Chief?  
A. Not that I ever knew of.
- Q. Do you know of any other husband of Red Sun?  
A. Yes, she had a husband named Wah-tah-she-kah, a Quapaw Indian, who died long before allotment.
- Q. Did Red Sun have any children by Wah-tah-she-kah?  
A. Yes, she had three, Sinnie Brown-Buffalo, Alice Brown-Buffalo and Boston Brown.
- Q. Are any of these children living?  
A. No, they are all dead.

first being duly sworn, answers the following questions:

Q. What is your name and age?

A. Witness or affiant - Francis Goodcagle,  
Sex - Male, about 60 years of age.

Q. Age - 60 years, acquainted with Red Sun Quapan and her family  
Tribe - Quapan.

Q. Allotment - No. 188.

Address - Baxter Springs, Kansas, R. F. D. No. 4.

Q. Means of knowledge - Good, having been for many years

A. She died June 23, 1911, or all his life a neighbor of the  
family of the decedent.

Q. Interest in case - None, since of her death

A. Examiner's impression of intelligence and credibility  
of witness - Good.

Q. Did she have any children by John Quapan?

A. She and John had a daughter, *Ira C. Deaver*, who is  
now living.

Q. Was Red Sun Quapan married prior to her marriage to  
John Quapan?

A. She was first married to Louis Tall Chief or Louis Angel?

Q. Did she have any children by Tall Chief?

A. I never knew of any.

Q. Did Red Sun have any other husbands?

A. I know of her being married to Wah-tah-she-kah, a Quapan  
Indian.

Q. Did she have any children by Wah-tah-she-kah?

A. Yes, she had three children by Wah-tah-she-kah.

Q. What were their names?

A. Elsie Brown-B. Hale, Alice Brown-Buffalo and Boston Brown.

Q. Are any of the above named children of Red Sun and  
Wah-tah-she-kah living?

A. No, they are all dead.

Q. Is Tall Chief or Louis Angel living or dead?

A. He is living. I understood that she separated from Tall Chief  
before her marriage to Wah-tah-she-kah.

Q. Is Wah-tah-she-kah living or dead?

A. He died long before allotment.
