RED SUN

In the matter of the heirship case of Red Sun Quapaw, deceased Quapaw allottee, Nos. 18 & 18, comes now, John Quapaw an allottee of the Quapaw Reserve, and who is of legal age and first being duly sworn, answers the following questions:

Q. What is your name and age?

A. My name is John Quapaw and I am about 54 years of age.

Q. What relation were you to Red Sun Quapaw?

A. She was my wife.

Q. About when did she die?

A. She died on the 23rd day of June, 1915.

Q. Did your wife, Red Sun have any children by you?

A. Yes, just one, a girl, Frances Quapaw Cokey, living.

Q. Did Red Sun ever have any children by any other man?

A. Yes. She was first married to Louis Tall chief, she had several children by Tall Chief, but they all died young.

Q. Is Tall Chief living or dead?

A. He is living.

Q. Were Tall Chief and Red Sun separated?

A. They separated under Indian custom a long time ago.

Q. Was she married to any other man besides Tall Chief?

A. Yes, she next married a Quapaw Indian whose name was Pah-ni-sah.

Q. Is Pah-ni-sah living or dead?

A. He died a long time ago.

Q. Did Red Sun have any children by Pah-ni-sah?

A. Yes, she had one child, but it died in infancy.

Q. Did Red Sun have any other husband?

A. Yes, after the death of Pah-ni-sah she married Wah-tah-she-kah.

Q. Did Red Sun have any children have any children by Wah-tah-she-kah?

A. Sinnie Brown-Buffalo, Alice Brown-Buffalo and Boston Brown.

Q. Is Sinnie Brown-Buffalo living or dead?

A. She is dead. (See Heirship case-Law-Heirship-119427-14-113904-14-F E.)

Q. Is Alice Brown-Buffalo living or dead?

A. She is dead. (See Heirship case Law-Heirship- 113505-14 F E).

Q. Is Boston Brown living or dead?

A. He is dead. (See Heirship case-Law-Heirship-113907-14-F E.)

Q. Did your wife make a will before she died?

A. Yes.

Q. Do you understand that she devised or gave to your daughter, Frances Quapaw Cokey, the home place and to you the forty acres over by Quapaw and the forty over in the woods, and to the children of Sinnie Brown Buffalo and Alice Brown-Buffalo, her interest in the allotment of Boston Brown.

A. Yes.

Q. Are you satisfied with this division of the property of your late wife?

A. Yes.
