In the matter of the heirship case of General Harrison, deceased Quapaw allottee No. 186, comes now John Beaver, Quapaw allottee No. 150, who being of legal age and first being duly sworn answers the following questions under oath:

Q. What is your name and age?

A. My name is John Beaver and I am about 60, years of age.

Q. Were you acquainted with General Harrison and his family history?

A. Yes.

Q. At the time of his death was he single or married?

A. He was married.

Q. What was his wife's name?

A. Isabelle Harrison, now Johnson.

Q. Were there any children born to Isabelle Harrison by General Harrison?

A. No.

Q. Was General Harrison ever married to any other woman?

A. Yes. He was married to Sophie Whiteeagle.

Q. Were there any children born to this woman by General Harrison?

A. Yes. One child which died in infancy prior to allotment.

Q. Is Sophie Whiteeagle the former wife of General Harrison living or dead?

A. She is dead.

Q. Was General Harrison ever married to any other woman except these two?

A. Yes. He was married to Meh-hun-ka-zhe-ka who is now living and is my wife.

Q. Were General Harrison and Meh-hun-ka-zhe-ka separated?

A. Yes.

Q. When did they separate, before or after allotment?

A. They were separated sometime prior to allotment under custom.

Q. ~~Who were~~ Were there any children born to Meh-hun-ka-zhe-ka by General Harrison?

A. Yes. One child, a son.

Q. What was this son's name and is he living or dead?

A. He died in infancy before he was named, prior to allotment.

A. Gah-hi-tun-ka.
- Q. About when did he die?  
A. He died a long time before allotment.
- Q. What was the name of General Harrison's mother?  
A. Wah-kah-tah-zhe.
- Q. About when did Wah-kah-tah-zhe die?  
A. She died a few years before allotment.
- Q. Did Gah-hi-tun-ka and Wah-kah-tah-zhe have any other children?  
A. Yes. Mah-zhing-tah-nah Xavier. These were all the children Gah-hi-tun-ka and Wah-kah-tah-zhe.
- Q. Did Gah-hi-tun-ka have any children by any other woman?  
A. Yes.
- Q. Name them?  
A. Frank Crow, Jim Crow, Elizabeth Crow and Mary J. Galf, all of whom are dead, all having died before allotment except Mary J. Galf.
- Q. Did Frank Crow have any children?  
A. No.
- Q. Did Jim Crow have any children?  
A. Yes Jim Crow was married and had a son named Robert Lottson who is dead.
- Q. Who was the mother of Robert Lottson?  
A. Kah-stet-tah
- Q. Is Robert Lottson's mother living or dead?  
A. She is dead.
- Q. About when did Robert Lottson die?  
A. He died about 8 years ago.
- Q. At the time of his death was he married or single?  
A. He was married.
- Q. What was his wife's name?  
A. Lucy Lottson, now Lewis. Living.
- Q. Did Robert Lottson have any children?  
A. Yes. He had six children all of whom died in infancy before allotment except one, Lou Lottson.
- Q. About when did Lou Lottson die?  
A. He died about a year ago. At the age of about 14 or 15 years
