In the matter of the heirship case of General Harrison, deceased Quapaw allottee No. 186 comes now Peter Clabber, who being of legal age and first being duly sworn answers the following questions under oath:

- A. What is your name and age?  
A. My name is Peter Clabber and I am 65 years of age.
- Q. Were you acquainted with General Harrison and his family history?  
A. Yes.
- Q. About when did he die?  
A. I do not know the exact date but it was right after allotment.
- Q. Was he married or single at the time of his death?  
A. He was married.
- Q. What was the name of his wife?  
A. Isabelle Harrison-n w Johnson. living.
- Q. Were there any children born to Isabelle Harrison by General Harrison?  
A. No.
- Q. ~~Was General Harrison ever married to any other woman prior to his marriage to Isabelle Harrison?~~  
A. Yes. He was married to Sophie White Eagle.
- Q. Were there any children born to Sophie White Eagle by General Harrison?  
A. Yes. They had one child which in infancy prior to allotment.
- Q. Is Sophie White Eagle living or dead?  
A. She is dead, having died several years before allotment.
- Q. Was he ever married to any other woman besides these two?  
A. Yes. He was married to Meh-hun-ka-zhe-ka Beaver, and he had one child, a boy, which died prior to allotment.
- Q. How was he married to these three wives, by Indian Custom or ceremony?  
A. He was married to Meh-hun-ka-zhe-ka Beaver and Sophie White Eagle by Indian Custom but I do not know how he was married to Isabelle Harrison.
- Q. Is Meh-hun-ka-zhe-ka Beaver living or dead?  
A. She is living.

- Q. Were Meh-hun-ka-zhe-ka Beaver and General Harrison separated?  
A. Yes. They were separated by Indian Custom prior to his marriage to Sophie White- Eagle.
- Q. Was he ever married to any other woman?  
A. I do not know of any other marriage.
- Q. Who was General Harrison's father?  
A. Cah-hi-tun-ka.
- Q. Is he living or dead?  
A. He died long before allotment.
- Q. Who was General Harrison's mother?  
A. Wak-ka-ta-zhe.
- Q. Is she living or dead?  
A. She is dead.
- Q. Did Cah-hi-tun-ka and Wak-ka-ta-zhe have any other children besides General Harrison?  
A. Yes. One, Mah-shing-tah-nah Xavier.
- Q. When did she die?  
A. About two years ago.
- Q. Was Cah-hi-tun-ka ever married to any other woman besides Wak-ka-ta-zhe?  
A. Yes.
- Q. What was her name?  
A. I do not know her name.
- Q. Did they have any children?  
A. Yes. Two boys and two girls. Frank Crow, Jim Crow, Elizabeth Crow, and Mary J. Calf, all of whom are dead.
- Q. About when did Frank Crow?  
A. He died several years before allotment.
- Q. Was he married at the time of his death?  
A. Yes. He was married but his wife is dead and he left no children.
- Q. About when did Jim Crow Die?  
A. He died before allotment.
- Q. Was he married at the time of his death?  
A. Yes. He was married to Kah-stet-tah.

- Q. Were there any children born to Jim Crow and Kah-stet-tah?  
 A. Yes. There was one, Robert Lottson, who is now dead.
- Q. Is Kah-stet-tah living or dead?  
 A. She is dead. She died long before allotment.
- Q. When did Robert Lottson die?  
 A. About six or seven years ago.
- Q. Was Jim Crow ever married to any other woman besides Kah-stet-tah?  
 Not that I know of.
- Q. Was Robert Lottson married or single at the time of his death?  
 A. He was married to Lucy Lottson, -Lewis, who is not living.
- Q. Were there any children born to Lucy Lottson by Robert Lottson?  
 A. Yes.
- Q. How many children did they have?  
 A. They had several children, but I do not know how many but they are all dead, none of them having been married or had any children.
- Q. Was Robert Lottson ever married to any other woman?  
 A. No.
- Q. Who was Robert's Lottson's father?  
 A. Jim Crow?
- Q. Who was his mother?  
 A. Her name was Kah-stet-tah.
- Q. Were there any other children born to Jim Crow and Kah-stet-tah besides Robert Lottson?  
 A. No.
- Q. Did Jim Crow have any children by any other woman?  
 A. No.
- Q. Did Kah-stet-tah have any other children by any other man?  
 A. Yes. She had three other children, a boy and two girls by John Beaver.
- Q. Is Jim Crow dead and if dead about when did he die?  
 A. He is dead, having died several years before the allotment of the Quapaw Reserve .
- Q. Were Kah-stet-tah and John Beaver married after the death of Jim Crow?  
 A. Yes.

- Q. What were the names of the three children born to Kah-stet-tah by John Beaver?
- Q. The oldest one, a girl, was named Meskah-no-zhe, who died prior to the death of her mother while yet a young girl. Alice Beaver-Bear was the next child and she is now living. Frank Beaver was the name of the last child and died at about the age of 10 years.
- Q. Is Kah-stet-tah living or dead, if dead about when did she die?
- A. She is dead, having died before the Quapaw Reserve was allotted.
- Q. Where was Robert Lottson living when he died?
- A. He was living in the Osage Nation on his wife's allotment.
- Q. What kind of an Indian was Lucy Lottson?
- A. She was an Osage Indian.
- Q. About when did Elizabeth grow die?
- A. She died more than 22 years ago.
- Q. At the time of her death was she married or single?
- A. She was married.
- Q. What was the name of her husband?
- A. I do not remember his name but he was a Cherokee Indian.
- Q. Were there any children born to her by this Cherokee Indian?
- A. No.
- Q. Had she ever been married previous to this marriage?
- A. No. Nor had she ever had any children.
- Q. About when did Mary J. Calf die?
- A. About two years ago.
- Q. At the time of her death was she married or single?
- A. No. She was a widow.
- Q. You say she was a widow, what was her husband's name?
- A. Buffalo calf.
- Q. Were there any children born to her by buffalo calf?
- A. Yes. Two boys.
- Q. What were their names?
- A. Frank Buffalo and Thomas Buffalo.
