Ran Lottson, born November 6, 1906, died November 7, 1906.

A. By Indian custom.
- Q. When were you married?
A. In the spring of 1893.
- Q. Was Robert Lottson ever married to any other woman?
A. Not that I know of.
- Q. Are these all the children of Robert Lottson?
A. Yes.
